

ADDITON TO THE KITCHEN SELECTION SHEET - the Franke sink

We are pleased to announce that there has been a further upgrade to the kitchen specification - we have sourced another sink option, a more expensive brand-name sink.

It is the Franke Ascona ASX611 - 860 stainless steel sink, which allows a strainer-basket fitting to be used. It also has a good deep bowl size - larger than the existing two sink options. See more information below.

As we believe this is a better option, for all flats where the tenant choses a mono-block tap (i.e., one that uses one hole in the sink-top), we shall specify this Franke sink.

We can still use the Leisure Rangemaster sink shown on the main sheet if a tenant prefers to have this sink.

Details of the strainer-basket feature



The basket sits in the sink and if pressed down, it seals the sink to allow it to be filled with water.

If pulled slightly up, it allows water to drain but catches most detritus in the shallow, wide basket.

To empty the basket in the bin, just pull lightly up by grasping the central section, and the basket comes away fully. It can be emptied in the bin, and indeed rinsed clean in the sink.

A sample of the sink is on display at the Lister office kitchen exhibition, so you can come and see it when it is your turn to be invited in to see the exhibition.

This sink can be used with the Miura Wing lever taps and the Axiom dual flow taps.
